Academy Wear: At the Academy, we believe that clothing should not distract from the safe and respectful learning environment that we strive to create. With that philosophy in mind, we follow a dress code called “Academy Wear” that specifically requires an Academy-logoed shirt purchased from Lands’ End, and khaki, navy, or black “bottoms” as available on the Lands’ End school uniform page of their website (or similarly styled bottoms from other retailers). Spirit Wear: The dress code also includes the option to wear Spirit Wear on selected days. EXTENDED DAY PROGRAM (EC/LS) / AFTER SCHOOL STUDY CLUB (MS)

The Extended Day Program (EDP) for children in Preschool through 4th grade and the After-School Study Club for Middle School students in 5th through 8th grade are both great ways to safely extend the school day.

EDP is in session before school beginning at 7:00 a.m. and after school dismissal (2:45 p.m.) until 6 p.m., Monday through Friday, on regular school days. Extended day service before school and after school dismissal through 5:30 p.m. is included in the tuition rates of all students in EC and LS; late pick-up is available from 5:30 to 6 p.m. for an additional fee. EDP may be scheduled in advance or on a drop-in, non-reservation basis. Scheduled EDP is preferred. Special Days are offered on parent-teacher conference days and teacher in-service days, as well as other non-Federal holidays when the Academy is not in session; on these days EDP is available from 7:30 a.m. until 6 p.m., by reservation only, at least a week in advance. EDP is also available free of charge without registration for the duration of your scheduled parent-teacher conference time. After-School Study Club provides a service to families who need to have a Middle School student remain at school beyond the school day (which ends for MS and US students at 3 p.m.). This option is available without a daily or hourly charge; however, we do charge a fee per sports season (three seasons per year). Middle School faculty members are available at the end of most school days for homework help until 3:45 p.m.; Study Club is available from 3 to 6 p.m. Registration is online through the [ON Suite](#).

Hot lunch, including vegetarian options, soup/sandwich, salad bar, and peanut butter and jelly is offered each day to all Academy students free of charge. The Academy's food service staff provides nourishing, balanced meals, and the Academy believes it is a part of the learning experience to encourage the students to eat what is provided and to try new foods. Exceptions will be made only for religious or medical reasons. (A physician's written recommendation is necessary for a medical exception.) Harrisburg Academy uses [ON Suite](#), an integrated, web-based classroom management and student information system to manage all major school information. Through ON, parents, students, and faculty, alike, have access

to schedules, directories, student progress reports, operational documentation, and more. All new families receive an email in August with full instructions on how to get started in ON, with directions to log in and documentation to learn about the system.

PARKING/DROP OFF/PICKUP

Drop-off procedures: School doors will be open for general drop-off beginning at 7:30 a.m. Families are encouraged to consider using the bus transportation provided by their school districts. Families who cannot use district transportation should arrange for students to arrive by 7:50 a.m. All students are expected to arrive at school by 7:50 a.m. to prepare for classes to begin at 8 a.m.

- **Early Childhood:** Upon arrival, caregivers may escort Preschool, JK, and Kindergarten students through the main doors of the building and report to the EC/LS library. Early Childhood students may take advantage of early drop off starting at 7 a.m. At 7:50 a.m., teachers escort the EC students to the John Butler Davis Gallery for our daily EC/LS Morning Meeting (lovingly known as "G2") before proceeding to the classrooms at 8 a.m.
- **Lower School:** All students in 1st through 4th grade should be dropped off at the main doors of the building. A teacher or administrator is stationed to assist students as they walk to the John Butler Davis Gallery. Classroom teachers provide Gallery supervision for LS students arriving between 7:30 a.m. and 7:50 a.m. Teachers escort students to the classrooms at 8 a.m. after our daily EC/LS Morning Meeting.
- **Middle and Upper School:** Parents of students in 5th through 12th grade should drop off their children in front of the building at the McCormick Auditorium entrance. MS students proceed to lockers and homeroom; US students proceed to lockers and 1st period classes beginning at 8 a.m.

Dismissal procedures:

- **Early Childhood:** Early Childhood pick up begins at 2:45 p.m. and occurs in your child's classroom until 3:05 p.m. Non-parents who are picking up children on a regular basis must be listed on the transportation form (located in ON); all caregivers should be prepared to show picture ID when picking up your child. After 3:05 p.m., all EC children who have not been picked up will be taken to the Extended

Day Program (EDP). Parents and caregivers picking up children from EDP should report to the main office.

- **Lower School:** Lower School parent pick up begins at 3 p.m. in the Gallery. Please avoid entering the building and waiting in the entryway before 2:45 p.m. Students are not permitted to meet parents outside or wait in the lobby to be picked up. Parents arriving after 3:15 p.m. should report to the main office to sign their child out from EDP. Children who are assigned to ride a bus will go to a designated area to wait for their buses to arrive.
- **Middle and Upper School:** Students who are assigned to ride a bus will go to a designated area to wait for their buses to arrive. Middle and Upper School pick up occurs through the McCormick Auditorium entrance. Middle School students whose transportation has not arrived by 3:15 p.m. must report to the After School Study Program. Upper School students are expected to leave for home at the conclusion of the school day unless they are involved in a school activity or working with a teacher.

Parking: All parent and visitor parking is located in the parking lot in front of the building. All parking spaces that do not have a number and those marked "Visitor" (or with a "V" above the number) are open to parents. The back and side parking lots are restricted to faculty and staff during work hours. Parents waiting to pick up a student at the end of the school day should park in a space and not line up in the front row of the parking lot – this creates hazardous conditions for those walking in the parking lot.

- **Reserved parking places:** Numbered parking places and the back and side parking lots are reserved for seniors, faculty, staff, and administrators. Additionally, be aware of the two parking spaces marked "reserved for the auction winners" in our front parking lot. These spaces (one in front at the main entrance and the other in front of the McCormick Auditorium entrance) are clearly marked and are reserved "24/7" for the entire 2018-19 academic year. We appreciate your consideration of the parents who have "won" the spots by generously donating to the Academy's annual Spring Gala. Similarly, the "reserved for Admission Office visitors" spot is reserved each school day.

REPORTING AN ABSENCE

Parents/guardians of students who will be absent due to illness, unavoidable medical appointment, or family emergency should call or email (attendance@harrisburgacademy.org) before 8:30 a.m. to report the absence. A homework request can be made at this time if appropriate. When the student returns to school, he or she must bring a note from a parent or guardian within three days stating the reason for the absence and its duration. For an illness-related absence of three or more consecutive school days, a doctor's note is required.
